Question - Suzanne - What will happen with the unspent fees from this year?

Cathy - we are in the process with the finance department to give back reimbursement. However, we have not been told that school is not going to come back this year. If school is back in June, we still need the money that was charged to families.

Lots of calculation need to be done so that every student receives the right amount back. What was already spent during the year and what needs to be refunded.

Upcoming field trips which were paid for have been refunded.

Once a decision is made that school will not be opening its doors for the remainder of the year, refunds will be given.
