Superintendent's Update: Students, Parents/Legal Guardians, and Staff

I hope that you all had a great week. It has been a week of excitement with students returning to schools and a special event on the Church's liturgical calendar. On January 10th we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, commemorating the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River. "You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit...how he went about doing good and healing...for God was with Him" (Acts 10:36-38). Indeed, through our baptism God is with all of us and the Holy Spirit serves as a constant source of inspiration, enlightenment and guidance.

We had a wonderful start back with in-person learning. As we continued to follow <u>public health measures</u> this week, on Thursday, January 14, 2021, we learned from Dr. Deena Hinshaw, Chief Medical Officer of Health, that regular school updates will be provided on the <u>Alberta Health website</u> and simplified terminology will be used. She explained that as of January 18, 2021, the following terms will be used by Alberta Health Services when describing positive cases of COVID-19 in schools:

Alert: 1-4 casesOutbreak: 5+ cases

The term "watch," which many partners found confusing, will no longer be used.

We have updated our <u>Parent Guidebook for Re-Entry: 2020-2021</u> accordingly, with any relevant changes. Our <u>website</u> and official social media channels (<u>Facebook, Twitter</u>, and <u>Instagram</u>) are also reliable sources of Division news and announcements.
